ARTIST RESIDENCY



PAA JOE GHANAIAN COFFIN MAKER MAY — JUNE 2013

Paa Joe and his son Jacob have travelled all the way from Ghana, to embark on an artist residency in the 'City Arts Dome' within the stunning surroundings of Clumber Park.

He is building his trademark lion coffin, one of the most powerful and important symbols of Africa.

BIOGRAPHY

Paa Joe is a master craftsman and the Grandfather of the fantasy coffin trade. Since sixteen he has been crafting beautiful coffins that represent the lives of the people for whom they are made – a Coca Cola bottle for a street vendor, or a lion for the head of a family. He has produced thousands of coffins, the majority of which lie deep under the ground.

In 2008 Paa Joe was forced from his workshop located in the centre of Accra to his storage hut two hours away. His Ghanaian customers didn't follow and the tourists stopped passing by. But as his coffin making business is floundering, there is one last hope, a UK exhibition in celebration of his work.

A handful of Paa Joe's works have already exhibited internationally as examples of the Ga culture – from the British Museum in London to Brooklyn Museum in New York – but this is not enough for him. Paa Joe wants his work, and his name, to be seen and recognized the world over.

This project is also supporting the production of a debut feature documentary, Paa Joe & The Lion, from award winning filmmaker Benjamin Wigley following Paa Joe's journey from craftsman to artist.

Paa Joe will relocate for one day to Rufford Country
Park. Visitors can watch him work and take part in
creative workshops and an artist's walk in and around the
sculpture garden within the country park.

GRAND FINALE & CELEBRATION SATURDAY 1 JUNE CLUMBER PARK DOORS OPEN, 5.30PM START TIME, 6.00PM

Join us at the Grand finale, as the coffin is celebrated, transforming Clumber Park into a Festival wonderland, full of fun, colour and revelry. FREE arts workshops will run during the day.

At twilight, the celebration of the coffin will commence - a vibrant and dazzling display of dancers, African inspired percussionists, including Sabar Soundsystem (www.sabarsoundsystem.com), a colliery band and giant puppets. Watch, join in and be a part of the celebration as the lion coffin makes its journey around the grounds of Clumber Park and across the lake. The event will culminate in Ghanaian inspired food and drink.

The event will be filmed as part of forthcoming feature documentary film, Paa Joe & The Lion.


PAA JOE & THE LION

Paa Joe & The Lion is an exploration into the vibrant history of the Ga culture, it's attitude to death and the conflict between art and craft, told through the story of Paa Joe, the Grandfather of the fantasy coffin trade. Paa Joe is a world-renowned craftsman, but since 2008 his coffin business has been declining. Forced to move from his central workshop in Ghana's capital, Accra, he has been working from a dusty roadside shack with little passing trade and few visits from tourists. If business continues like this, his name, workshop and legacy will disappear like the thousands of coffins he has masterfully produced that now lay deep under the ground.

Together with his son, Jacob, Paa Joe is preparing to affirm his position in the Western art world. His residency in the UK, and the coffin, will be celebrated at Clumber Park. The juxtaposition between the English countryside and the unique craft and vibrant celebration will not only be visually stunning and challenging but act as a way of raising questions about the West's view on "ethnic" folk art/craft.

The film will showcase Paa Joe's past, present and future. In 1989 Jimmy Carter visited Paa Joe's workshop and bought two coffins, in 1998 Bill Clinton stopped by. In 2009, it was a different story - his present will be conveyed through the environment in which he now works; the busy roadside acting as the soundtrack to his working day, the empty logbook and the coffins gathering dust in his workshop. We will also focus on his family and community.

Paa Joe's mother encouraged him to become a coffin maker when he was 16 years old and sent him to work with the founder of the craft, Kane Kwei. She died in December 2012 aged 107 but we were fortunate enough to meet her in the summer and were invited back to document her funeral and Paa Joe making her casket. Through her death, we are given a rare and raw insight into the depths of the Ga community, the importance that they put on the funeral celebrations and how they prepare the deceased for their next chapter in the afterlife.
